### STUDENTS HELPING TO BUILD COMMUNITIES

*“A Trinity Christian College accounting professor, two students, and I traveled to Malawi in January. Malawi is an extremely disadvantaged country, but as their people like to say, it’s the warm heart of Africa. Many business men and women there have neither training nor resources for managing the financial aspects of their businesses. The trip was a great success in addressing this problem. We were able to train and equip an intermediary microfinance organization, CHREAM (Christian Entrepreneurs Assisting Malawi), with materials we had created that allow local business owners to easily keep financial records. This allows CHREAM to help businesses plan out the best use of the micro loans they offer, thereby building communities from within.
